Collective Worship Policy

September 2025

Core Principles:

- We will provide the opportunity for everyone to achieve their full potential.
- We have high expectations for ourselves and each other.
- We will ensure that the Christian values of Love, Hope and Courage are at the heart of our community.
- We celebrate the unique qualities of each child and ensure their individual needs are met.
- We will foster effective partnerships with home involving parents and carers in their child's education and encourage their support of school life.
- We will ensure all children, regardless of background or starting points, have access to an inspiring and engaging curriculum that promotes learning and develops them into confident young people.

Aims:

Through collective worship in our school we aim to provide an experience that lets children:

- reflect upon God and give Him honour
- explore their own beliefs
- be active partners in the planning, delivery and evaluation of worship
- experience and nurture the spiritual dimension through worship
- experience something special and separate from ordinary school activities
- develop a community spirit, a common ethos and shared values
- reinforce positive attitudes and our Christian values of Love, Hope and Courage
- explore themes related to our values such as compassion, generosity, love, forgiveness and friendship
- experience spiritual, moral and cultural development
- cultivate awe and wonder of the world and develop an awareness of our responsibility to look after our planet
- celebrate their uniqueness and preciousness in the eyes of others and God
- introduce children to Christian language and symbolism and the cycle of the church year.
- explore a variety of ways of praying and introduce children to some well-known Christian prayers, e.g. Lord's Prayer.

Elements of Worship Collective worship should be inclusive, spiritual and educational.

It should be inclusive:

- pupil centred, related to pupils own experience and relevant to pupil concerns
- acknowledge diversity
- celebrate gifts, talents and achievements
- enable children to participate and respond, by active involvement or listening and reflection
- match the needs of pupils
- foster a sense of community
- develop personal relationships and encourage social development

It should be spiritual:

- ensure children feel calm, relaxed and secure
- be a special time conducive to worship
- foster feelings such as awe, wonder, thankfulness, mystery and joy
- provide opportunities for children to take part in a variety of spiritual experiences
- allow time to be still, encouraging children to make effective use of silence for reflection, contemplation, meditation and prayer
- provide an opportunity for children to appreciate their worth and value to God and to the community, and to respect all individuals as children of God
- provide an opportunity to bring before God in prayer, personal needs and those of others
- include a variety of words, music, images, artefacts and symbols.

It should be educational:

- reflect on values and concerns of the school community and the community it serves
- provide an opportunity to empathise with the needs of others
- enable children to share some of the central teachings of the Christian faith at an appropriate level
- provide children with a vocabulary of worship
- encourage respect and care of God's creation by a positive attitude to local and global environmental issues
- provide opportunities to celebrate major and minor Christian festivals

Collective Worship Planning

Our Collective worship is planned over a two year cycle. It is evaluated continuously and adapted to suit the needs of our learners and the world at the present. Over the two year cycle, we focus on 12 Christian Values and use Roots and Fruits as a basis for our worship. We also focus on a British Value for each half term and celebrate a range of current celebrations and events. We have weekly worship led by the local clergy and a weekly praise worship. Every half term, our pupils lead a worship based on the Christian Value which is the focus.

All our worship start with our opening prayer and the lighting of the candles. Our Ethos group lead this along with our closing prayers which are chosen from our prayer folder containing prayers for all occasions and those written by past and present pupils.

Monday	Led by Mrs Grand and is based on the Christian value for the half term.
Tuesday	Led by Miss Bennett and is based on current news using Picture News and linked to British Values.
Wednesday	Led by Mrs Lawson and is based on singing and music, their words and meanings.
Thursday	Led by local clergy and is based on the Christian calendar.
Friday	Led by Mrs Grand and is a praise worship celebrating our achievements in our Christian Values and our learning.

During the year, we attend St Thomas the Martyr Church in UpHolland to lead and participate in collective worship.
