Choose the correct verb form 'me gusta/me gustan' according to the number of nouns.

- Use the appropriate indefinite articles un, una, unos and unas.
- Use adjectives (colours) and place them after the noun.
- Ask questions using the topic vocabulary.
- Count up 100 in Spanish.

...some children will be able to:

- Add modifiers to their opinions.
- Change adjectives to feminine and plural when needed.
- Use the appropriate direct object pronoun lo/la/los/las to replace a noun.

...most children will be able to:

- interpret a chart written in Spanish;
- write words and phrases from memory with support;
- make nouns/adjectives 'agree' according to their gender and number;
- use 'Me gusta/Me gustan' accurately with singular and plural nouns;
- ask/answer at what time a restaurant opens and closes on a particular day

....some children will be able to:

- spell adjectives correctly according to their gender/ number;
- vary sentences by substituting other verbs, nouns or adjectives;
- write sentences from memory;
- express what they would like to order at a restaurant with full sentences and detailed answers.
